
Human v. Nonhuman


Defined as:



The current most popular forms of disseminating research are inefficient. The biggest barriers to public accessibility are money and knowledge. The most recent attempt to bridge that gap takes the form of visual abstracts, which do ensure a wider audience but do not ensure a deeper understanding. There's a huge trade off in deep understanding and breadth of audience.

Barriers

Knowledge

Researchers don't have the translation skills to make their findings more accessible, and the public doesn't have the technical knowledge and context to fully understand the research

Time

Both researchers and their audience don't have time to build a real connection and ensure a complete understanding of the work

Money

There's a paywall to accessing scientific journals. Researchers need to be paid, but the public needs to have access

Narrative Theory

Narrative Theory studies the connection between human perception and narrative. We use narratives to organize knowledge and lived experience into a structure that we can understand at a deeper level. It's a subconscious, neuro-biological process that puts information in a way that cultivates significance and impact.

This project seeks to utilize narrative theory to contextualize climate findings and encourage personal connection to the facts. As individuals gain the opportunity to craft their own narratice responses, they gain a deeper understanding of the research.




To create a platform that bridges the gap between climate research and public reception via narrative theory and art.

User Flows


