- > Named the bisexual flower



Human Perspective

The gender binary is vital to a system of heteronormativity. Because it's the creation of two opposing, seemingly completely separate genders.

MAHU


NADLEEHI





Current Size System




History of the Size System



Rethinking Sizing

The redesign of the system aims to abolish the need for the existing "male" and "female" sizing systems. It uses a 3 code system of identification.

Sizes exist in a circular system that allows for a continuous loop



- **01** A numerical measurement of a part of the body
- **02** The direction the leaflet is pointing indicates the measurement of the wearers body
- O3 The size scale exists on a color wheel so that one can easily compare sizes and quickly recognize a size that they prefer








Open the Leaf Sizing app to start measuring yourself on the genderless size chart. Tap to continue and set up your profile and find your measurements.




Once the profile is set up the "my leaflets" is the main page a user would encounter. Here the user can have quick access to their size information and their fit preferences.

Top tag highlights the chest width, when removed the sale tag reveals other details like torso and arm length




Cut out indicates a range on the size spectrum for quick access to your size




